#### **Activity Board Report**

The 2025-2026 season is underway, as more activities and events are resuming, the Activities calendar is starting to fill in. Starting in November the calendar will have more details/instructions on the back. Be sure to pick up a copy of the calendar when it comes out.

Here are a few highlights:

**Nov. 11**<sup>th</sup> – Veterans Day Golf Cart Parade and Lunch – The parade will start at 11:00 am at the Clubhouse, lunch will begin at 12:00 pm. Veterans eat for free, for all others the cost is \$7.00.

Lunch will include a sloppy joe sandwich, chips, pickle, dessert and a beverage. Please bring your own table setting. Sign up is required for both vets and non-vets.

Nov. 14<sup>th</sup> & 15<sup>th</sup> – Fall Craft Fair – For those of you new to the community, proceeds from the vendor table rentals, raffle and Pot of Gold support Citrus Ridge activities. Baked good sales support our Sunshine outreach and the lunch proceeds fund sun deck accessories. Friday, the 14<sup>th</sup> from 3:00-5:00 pm is for residents only. ## Important Information for 2025/2026 Activity Chairpersons (updated 10/2025)

If you've signed up for an activity, **THANK YOU!** Below are some frequently asked questions.

**Q**: How do I add my event to the monthly calendar?

A: There are three ways to do this. First, you can attend the Inc. Board Calendar meeting which is held the second Tuesday of the month in the Activity Hall. Secondly, you can complete the "Form for Placement or Change of Event on Upcoming Calendar" found in the Club House where all activities are posted and return it to Jo Brutsman, Lot #78. Third, you can email Jo addition/change of event at brutsmancrb@yahoo.com.

**Q:** I'm a new chairperson stepping in for someone else. How do I transfer any budget money to my name?

A: See Lynette Parker (Inc. Treasurer, Lot #79) to complete the Budget Transfer Form. Lynette will ensure the transfer happens seamlessly. She will also provide you a detailed listing of debits and credits to your committee account.

**Q**: As a chairperson, what are my responsibilities?

**A:** You have multiple responsibilities as a chairperson.

- 1) Ensure your upcoming events are on the calendar in a timely fashion and notices are posted throughout the Citrus Ridge community. Be sure the information is detailed (date, time, location, cost, sign up required? dish to pass?) and accurate.
- 2) For events including kitchen use, obtain a copy of the Kitchen Procedure from Jane Kissel, Lot 424.
- 3) Notify your participants in advance (Citrus Ridge Unofficial FB page, door notices, etc.) when a community event (meeting, dance, entertainment, etc.) is planned for the location you usually use, for example: a dance is booked in the Clubhouse on a Thursday evening where Euchre usually takes place. Jo Brutsman (calendar) will notify the Euchre chairperson of the conflict, who then notifies Euchre participants). If a personal event is booked for the Activity Hall, the board member responsible for booking the event (Karen Flanagan, Lot 443) will notify you ASAP of the conflict.
- 4) Prepare the location (Activity Hall or Club House) for the event. This includes plugging in the cordless vacuum cleaner in advance to let it charge.
- 5) Ensure the location is cleaned (tables wiped down, chairs and tables returned to their original configuration, cards and games put away, trash removed, cordless cleaner emptied, unplugged and return to the closet. If the carpet is soiled, use the carpet cleaner to

remove the spills. Relock the restroom doors from the clubhouse side. Sports equipment must be cleaned and returned to its appropriate location.

6) If funds were collected, meet with Lynette Parker to complete the proper paperwork for banking your funds. For major activities (i.e. Senior Olympics, Memorial event, Veterans Day, Dances Craft Fair), complete the Event Report and return it to Peggy Bradley, Lot 140. This form was designed to document pluses and opportunities to improve the next offering and to transfer that information to any new chairpersons.


